



Parent with Child Protection Concern

The arrangements for parents to make known to staff any concerns they may have about the safety of their (or another) child should be clear, including how to contact the school, class teacher, the Designated Teacher for Child Protection or the Principal if they are worried about a safeguarding or child protection concern. The process for a parent who has a potential safeguarding or child protection concern is set out below.

If a parent has a potential child protection concern:

I have a concern about my/another child's safety



I can talk to the class teacher



If I am still concerned, I can talk to the Child Protection Designated Teacher: Chris Kennedy or the Deputy Designated Teachers: Kathy Boyle/Karanne McGrath (TOPS Project)



If I am still concerned, I can talk/write to the Representative of Board of Governors
Loretta Jones (In hospital)/Pat McConnell (ETA/TOPS)
